SUBMISSION CONDITIONS (CHECKLIST)

(or "how to avoid a preliminary rejection")

* Basic requirements that do not exclude the need of full compliance of the other rules in the RBCCRIM Editorial Policy (https://www.ibccrim.org.br/docs/2020/PUBLISHING RULES.pdf)

- ✓ Is the article unpublished and free of plagiarism? Is it not being reviewed for publishing by another journal? When an identical or similar paper has been published somewhere else (even if in another language), this must be reported to the editor at the time of the paper submission to this Journal.
- ✓ Has the submission form been completed? http://bit.ly/2RJ40pB
- ✓ Does the paper address issues that relate to criminal sciences and is it compatible with the RBCCRIM editorial segment?
- ✓ Is there a title, abstract (up to 200 words), and five keywords, in the paper's original language and in English, plus a summary (in the paper's language)?
- ✓ Is the paper presented in topics and does it have **specific items for the introduction, final** remarks (or conclusions) and references?
- ✓ Does the paper have between 20 and 40 pages with no paragraph spacing, 1.5 between lines, Times New Roman font (size 12 in the body text) and 2.0 cm top and bottom margins as well as 3.0 cm margins on the sides?
- ✓ Are the author qualifications, ORCID number and email address presented?
- ✓ In case the paper has received funding, is the public notice information listed in the footnote?
- ✓ If the paper brings unpublished results of empirical research involving humans, is there a footnote mentioning the ethics committee approval?
- ✓ Does the paper use updated bibliographical **references** from national and foreign authors representing the theme?
- ✓ Does the paper fully respect the other rules of the RBCCRIM Editorial Policy?
